

CONSUMER PRICE INDICES AND INFLATION RATES FOR MARCH 2023

The overall year on year inflation rate as measured by the Consumer Price Index (CPI) was 9.2 per cent, in March 2023. As presented in Tables 1 and 2, the rise in inflation was largely due to increase in prices of commodities under food and non-alcoholic beverages (13.4%); and housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels (7.5%); and transport (12.6%) between March 2022 and March 2023. These three divisions account for over 57 per cent of the weights of the 13 broad categories. Prices of commodities under furnishings, household equipment and routine household maintenance recorded an increase of 7.5 per cent over the period.

The CPI increased by 0.8 per cent from an index of 130.13 in February 2023 to 131.18 in March 2023 The month-to-month Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages Index increased by 1.6 per cent between February 2023 and March 2023.

As shown in Table 3, the prices for cabbages, carrots and potatoes (Irish) increased by 8.9, 8.5 and 8.0 per cent, respectively between February 2023 and March 2023. During the same period, prices of onions- leeks and bulbs, cooking oil(salad) and tomatoes decreased by 0.9, 0.7 and 0.3 per cent, respectively.

The Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' Index, increased by 0.6 per cent between February 2023 and March 2023. This was mainly due to increase in prices of electricity which went up by 11.6 per cent for 50 Kilowatts and 9.0 per cent for 200 kilowatts between February 2023 and March 2023. In addition, prices of gas/ LPG rose by 1.2 per cent during the same period.

The Transport Index went up by 0.3 per cent between February 2023 and March 2023. The increase was mainly due to rise in petrol prices by 1.1 per cent in the same period.
