## **DOMESTIC NEWS**

The domestic unit held steady against the dollar in a rather active trading session on Wednesday.

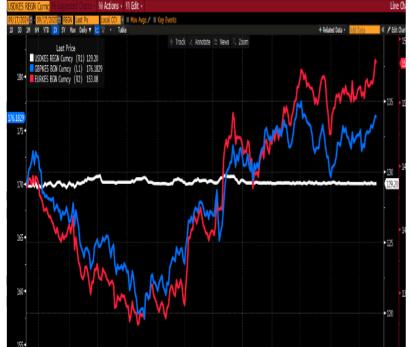
Market activity remained in a lull, with most of the volume driven by corporate participants. The local currency remained steady, supported by balanced flows across the counters. The Bond auctions yesterday were successful, garnering bids worth KES 97BIn against KES 40BIn offered and a total of KES 61BIn was accepted for 12.8 and 22.2 years to maturity bonds.

In the near term, we expect the home unit to remain range bound, with directionality dictated by flows from key sectors.

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## **INTERNATIONAL NEWS**

The US Dollar gained ground after Wednesday's FOMC rate decision, as it attempted to claw back a portion of this week's losses. The Fed announced a gentle quarterpoint interest rate cut to 4%-4.25%, something many market watchers had anticipated following months of pressure from the White House. This marks the Fed's first rate cut in nine months. The Fed's Summary of Economic Projections also indicated that Fed policymakers foresee more rate adjustments with two additional quarter-point cuts this year. The dot plot suggests that most policymakers anticipate interest rates will reach about 3.5-3.75% by the end of the year. Markets now await jobless claims and Philly Fed Manufacturing index today.

The Euro reversed course and dropped against the US Dollar amid a perceived hawkish cut of 25 bps by the Fed on Wednesday. The Eurozone docket featured the Harmonized Index of Consumer Prices (HICP) for August came at 2% YoY, below forecasts and July's 2.1% print. Core HICP was aligned with estimates and unchanged from the previous reading of 2.3%. Markets await speeches from ECB officials today.

GBP/USD surged into its highest in eleven weeks on Wednesday but lost ground back to the opening levels, after the Fed delivered its first interest rate cut of the year. August's inflation in the UK came in line with estimates at 3.8% YoY. Core CPI cooled from 3.8% to 3.6% YoY, and both reported readings were aligned with the BoE's latest projections. The Bank of England will announce its rate decision today with markets expecting the MPC to vote 7-2 to keep rates unchanged.

The Japanese Yen fell on Thursday as the US Dollar strengthened, extending losses after the FOMC meeting that pulled the Yen from its July 7 peak. Fresh data showed Japan's Core Machinery Orders dropped 4.6% in July from the prior month, while annual growth slowed to 4.9% from 7.6% in June. The weaker-thanexpected figures added pressure on the Yen during Asian tradina.
